Communication, Language and Literacy:

- Learn to form lowercase and capital letters correctly.
- Use Monster Phonics to recognise single sounds, digraphs and trigraphs in reading and writing.
- Apply our phonics knowledge through games and activities.
- Continue to recognise key words out of context.
- Begin to write simple sentences.
- Share stories and talk about them.
- Learn to listen and retell information and stories.
- Learn and use new vocabulary.

Mathematics:

- Counting songs.
- Match subitising quantities to numerals.
- Order numbers.
- Count with one to one correspondence.
- Play counting games inside and outside.
- Represent numbers in different ways.
- Learn about the composition of numbers.
- Compare mass and capacity.
- Compare length and height.

Expressive Arts and Design:

- Engaging with different role play areas.
- Using a range of small world play.
- Using puppets to retell and create stories.
- Designing and building 3d models exploring joining techniques.
- Copying and learning different dance moves.
- Learning songs, rhymes and copy and making musical rhythms.
- Exploring mark making using pencil.
- Exploring and using a range of different materials.

Personal, Social & Emotional Development:

- Citizenship-learning about 'Me and My World'.
- Healthy and Safer lifestyles - learning about 'Keeping Safe'.

Understanding the World:

- Learn about the festival of Chinese New Year.
- Making and tasting different foods including porridge, noodles, pancakes.
- Making and discussing simple maps.
- Winter and seasonal changes.
- Local walks and road safety.
- Exploring and comparing different countries in the world.

Religious Education:

We will be learning about the following units:

- 'How can we help others when they need it?'
- 'Why do Christians put a cross in an Easter Garden?'

As well as exploring stories from other faiths.

How you can help your child:

- Practice dressing/ undressing—uniform and PE kit.
- Practice doing up coat zips.
- Regular reading and phonics practice, including writing.
- Practice reading and writing simple sentences.
- Practice counting to 20, forwards and backwards.
- Practice using a knife and fork to cut up their own food.

Physical Development:

- Take part in large movement activities such as building with crates, scooters
- Take part in fine motor activities to build strength in our hands.
- Use tools such as scissors, brushes, pencils with increasing control to form shapes and letters correctly. Developing correct pencil grip.
