#### Communication, Language and Literacy:

- Write the letters of our name.
- Learn the letter sounds of the alphabet.
- Give meaning to marks we make.
- Use Monster Phonics to explore different types of sounds, orally blend sounds to make words, hear words beginning with the same sounds.
- Apply our phonics knowledge through games and activities.
- Listen to and retell information and stories.
- Learn and use new vocabulary.

#### Mathematics:

- Recognise numerals to 5 and beyond.
- Play counting games inside and outside.
- Represent numbers in different ways.
- Rote count in order from 0-10
- Compare mass and capacity.
- Compare length and height.
- Name, and explore 2D and 3D shapes.

#### Expressive Arts and Design:

- Engaging with different role play and small world areas.
- Using puppets to retell and create stories.
- Drawing from observation.
- Learning about the artist Eric Carle.
- Designing and building 3d models exploring joining techniques.
- Learning songs, rhymes and copy and making musical rhythms.
- Exploring mark making using pencil.
- Exploring and using a range of different materials.



### Minibeasts, Growing and Transport



#### Personal, Social & Emotional Development:

- Take turns and work with others.
- Talk about my feelings and those of others.

#### Understanding the World:

- Life cycles of plants and animals.
- Planting and growing seeds
- Minibeasts and their habitats
- Drawing simple maps.
- Summer and seasonal changes.
- Exploring and comparing transport now, in the past and around the world.

#### Religious Education:

We will be learning about what makes everyone special and how we can help to take care of our wonderful world.

As well as exploring stories from other faiths.

#### How you can help your child:

- Practice rubbing in their own sun-cream.
- Practice dressing/ undressing
- Point out letters in the environment and talk about the sounds they make.
- See how many number.....3's they can spot on a walk.
- Practice using a knife and fork to cut up their own food.
- Play board game/ turn taking games.

#### Physical Development:

- Take part in large movement activities such as building with crates, riding trikes
- Take part in fine motor activities to build strength in our hands.
- Use tools such as scissors, brushes, pencils with increasing control to form shapes and letters correctly. Developing correct pencil grip.

- Fundamental skills (ball skills)
