## Welcome Back

Now that the children have settled in, below is just some key information for the year ahead.

## PEKit

PE kits need to be kept in school. Our PE days are Mondays and Tuesdays. Please ensure kits are suitable for both indoor and outdoor activities. Further information can be found on our website.

## Water Bottles

We would like all children to bring in a named water bottle (for water only, no squash or flavoured water please) and a healthy snack if your child is in Year 3. Fruit is provided for all children in Year 2.



## Equipment

Year 2 children will have a book bag and all Year 3 children have now been given a zip wallet to bring in their belongings. Apart from their P.E. bag (where we recommend a draw string bag for ease of storage in the corridor) we ask that you try and avoid bringing additional bags as all stationery will be provided. No pencil cases required.



## Homework

Updates, important information (including the weekly homework linked to our current topic) and useful resources will all be uploaded and accessed through Google Classroom. Please can you let the office know if you have trouble accessing this.

Weekly maths challenges and spelling homework will be set on and will be set by Mrs Evans on a Thursday. It is also recommended that TTRockstars is used to support your child's learning of timetables. Little and often has the greatest impact and the tables set will be appropriate for what your child is currently learning. Please do contact Mr Williamson if you have problems accessing the platform.



## Reading

Each member of Rabbit class has now been allocated a reading book and these will be changed as they are finished. Reading books need to be in every day along with their reading records. Phonics and Guided Reading will be taking place on a daily basis. We love to see children developing a real joy for reading, and this can happen in many different ways at home. Please encourage your child to read regularly, whether it's their school book, a library book, a favourite story from your shelves, a magazine, a comic, or even a recipe you are cooking together. Sharing books by reading aloud to your child is just as valuable too. We would be delighted if you could record any of these reading experiences in your child's reading record so we can celebrate their growing confidence and enjoyment of reading.
